Judi's House/JAG Institute is excited to share our Family Bereavement Fellowship – a two-year concentrated post-graduate program designed to provide hands-on training with our team of grief experts. In addition to receiving outstanding training and supervision, fellows may apply to become a Comprehensive Grief Care® *Pathfinders* Provider upon successful completion of the program.

Mission Help children and families grieving a death find connection and healing.

Vision No child should be alone in grief.

Eligibility Requirements

- Two-year commitment (August 2025 – August 2027)
- Degree from a post-graduate program in the mental health field
- Pursuing clinical licensure (LPC, LCSW, LMFT, etc.)
- Registration with Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies
- On-site work Monday – Thursday with availability until 8:30 p.m.

What You Will Receive from the Fellowship

- A comprehensive specialization in grief care practices across the lifespan
- Meaningful, reflective supervision that encourages enduring self-awareness and assessment
- Skills to integrate justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion considerations and practices into all areas of work
- Concentrated knowledge in one or more area(s) of interest to apply to future career
- Direct contact and supervision hours to count toward clinical licensure
- Qualification to become a Comprehensive Grief Care® *Pathfinders* provider

Fellow Expectations

- Three-day orientation in August 2025
- Weekly individual supervision
- Direct Client Care
 - Group Therapy (in-house and school-based)
 - Non-Group Therapy (individual, couples, family, etc.)
 - Assessments
- Participation in weekly Clinical Review meeting
- Regular didactic trainings on topics such as:
 - Play Therapy
 - Parenting
 - Diversity
 - Systems Care
 - Ethics
- Quarterly recording and evaluation of clinical work
- Yearly case presentations
- Up to two subspecialty rotations
- Ongoing dedication to the organization's mission and vision
- Commitment to learning and openness to feedback
- Contributing member of the Judi's House team

Subspecialty Descriptions

In alignment with our JEDI (Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion) initiative, Fellows are encouraged to participate in advancing our JEDI principles in their subspecialties.

School-Based Care

Fellows with a school-based care focus may provide interventions in Denver-Metro area schools, classroom and professional grief workshops, consultations with district partners, and community outreach.

Administration

Fellows interested in this area of concentration may shadow clinical leadership meetings, work on special projects related to program operations and training, gain exposure to grant writing, and develop specialized supervisory skills.

Communications

Fellows who are a part of this specialty may collaborate with our Development and Communications Team, support with fundraising events, or develop a social media campaign.

Project Management

Be a part of preparing and coordinating special Judi's House programming events including Hope for the Holidays, Memorial Event, and Children's Grief Awareness Open House.

Volunteer Coordination

Grief centers frequently rely on the generosity of volunteers to support bereavement care for children and families. Learn the ins and outs of recruiting, training, and retaining these essential members in non-profit work.

Early Childhood

This subspecialty is for fellows who have a passion for working with pre-school aged children. Fellows with an early childhood concentration may facilitate and evaluate programming geared towards our 3 - 5 year-old clients and their caregivers.

Evaluation and Research

The Program Team at Judi's House/JAG Institute works closely with our in-house Evaluation and Research Team. Fellows who want more insight into the evaluation and research process at Judi's House/JAG Institute may support ongoing program evaluation, our *Childhood Bereavement Changemaker* (CBC) initiative, Childhood Bereavement Estimation Model (CBEM) report development, or investigate research questions under staff supervision.
